

B.SC. CLINICAL PSYCHOLOGY

PROGRAMME OUTCOMES (POs)

The program is designed to enable students to actively interact with, and investigate the dynamic interrelations between the human being and the environment. The program specifically focuses on the study of human interaction with significant others, society, environment, and machine interface through directed research in the laboratory, library, and field settings. The program facilitates students to have first-hand experience in various fields of psychology. Further, it endeavours to inculcate research culture among students. Finally, it focuses on the holistic development of the student through the incorporation of curricular aspects with personal growth.

1. Foundational Knowledge: Students will demonstrate core concepts, theories, and methodologies in psychology, including areas such as cognitive psychology, social psychology, developmental psychology, abnormal psychology, Indian psychology and research methods.

2. Critical Thinking and Analysis: Students develop strong critical thinking skills and the ability to critically analyze psychological theories, research findings, and real-world issues. They will be able to evaluate evidence, identify logical arguments, and draw informed conclusions.

3. Research Skills: They acquire research skills necessary for designing, conducting, and evaluating psychological research. This includes knowledge of research methodologies, data collection techniques, statistical analysis, interpretation of findings, and ethical considerations in research.

4. Communication Skills: Demonstrate effective written and oral communication skills, including the ability to articulate complex psychological concepts, present research findings and engage in professional communication with diverse audiences.

5. Ethical and Professional Conduct: Students can adhere to ethical guidelines and principles in psychology, demonstrating integrity, respect for diversity, confidentiality, and responsible conduct in research, practice and professional interactions.

6. Applied Knowledge and Practical Skills: Students will be able to apply psychological principles and theories to practical settings, such as counseling, clinical practice,

organizational settings, education, or community interventions. They will develop practical skills relevant to their chosen career paths.

7. Critical Evaluation and Synthesis: Students can demonstrate the ability to critically evaluate and synthesize information from multiple sources, integrate diverse perspectives, and apply a multidisciplinary approach to understanding complex psychological phenomena.

8. Professional Development: They will engage in ongoing professional development, including staying updated with current research, trends, and best practices in psychology. They may also pursue further education, certifications, or licensure in specialized areas of psychology.

9. Leadership and Teamwork: Students can develop a sense of self perception which can help them improve their personal strengths and areas of growth. This can facilitate working effectively in interdisciplinary teams, collaborate with colleagues, and demonstrate interpersonal skills such as teamwork, leadership and conflict resolution in diverse settings.
